News items from 2nd quarter of 2013

1 - News Subject: New Mayor Elected

Date	Description
4/1	A new mayor gets selected today. Tim Kabat and Doug Farmer both talk about controlling costs of local government.
4/2	Tim Kabat wins by a margin of 2-to-1.
4/3	Kabat revealed some of the plans he's been working on for his 1 st hundred days.
4/9	Tim Kabat gets sworn in next week. Outgoing mayor Matt Harter has packed up and is ready to move on.
4/16	Tim Kabat has a new job – Mayor of LaCrosse, starting today.
4/17	Tim Kabat says the mood in LaCrosse is “hopeful” as he assumes office.
4/18	Getting people to work together in city hall is one of the key promises of Kabat's campaign.
4/20	Gregg Cleveland says he's optimistic about the next 4 years. The LaCrosse fire chief was in conflict with Matt Harter over the last 4 years about funding of the Fire Department.

2 - News Subject: Surveillance Cameras

Date	Description
4/5	A private organization is fundraising to install dozens of cameras downtown. Once installed, the system will be turned over to the city police.
4/5	Committee has backed plan to put cameras in downtown LaCrosse
4/8	Despite fears of Big Brother, the City Council seems ready to approve installing a network of security cameras downtown.
4/10	Brushing off “Big Brother” concerns, the city council has agreed to back a plan to put security cameras in downtown. Final vote comes tomorrow night.
4/19	Cameras in Boston may make the difference between catching a bomber. LaCrosse plans cameras for downtown to help out in local cases.
4/24	Surveillance cameras helped identify the Boston bombing suspects. That's exactly how cameras could work in LaCrosse.
5/22	A major donation is expected today in the effort to add public surveillance cameras in downtown LaCrosse. City Vision Foundation launched an effort to raise hundreds of thousands of dollars earlier this year to make it possible.
5/24	There's support from the Mayor's Office for the Safe-Cam project in LaCrosse. Tim Kabat says people shouldn't have concerns about getting videoed.

3 - News Subject: Oktoberfest Announces Changes

Date	Description
4/4	Oktoberfest could be in for a boost. The City Council will vote on diverting room tax money to help pay the costs for the parades.
4/5	One city council committee has left it up to another committee to consider giving hotel room tax money to offset parade costs.
4/6	CVB advisory council member Pat Stephens doesn't think hotel room tax money should be used to offset parade costs for Oktoberfest.
4/9	Council might vote tonight to give Oktoberfest some relief from city fees.
4/10	Oktoberfest isn't exactly getting the cold shoulder, but they're not getting the love, either. The Council voted to put off the decision on using hotel room tax money to help offset parade costs.
5/22	Oktoberfest will be a 4-day celebration next year, so 2013 will be the last 9-day Fest.
6/14	City police will spend thousands less on overtime when Oktoberfest goes to only 4 days.

4 - News Subject: Assistant City Attorney Fired

Date	Description
4/19	After more than a year on paid leave, the City of LaCrosse has fired Pete Kiskin. The list of accusations is long, and includes engaging in personal and sexual relationships at work while using City resources. Insubordination, and many more items.
5/24	There might be a reason Pete Kiskin lingered on paid leave for nearly a year before getting fired – maybe 32 reasons. Extensive documents were delivered to City Hall laying out 32 points that led to him getting fired.

5 - News Subject: Cool, Wet Spring

Date	Description
4/25	LaCrosse is just a day away from tying a record a record nobody wants. April 26 is the latest the City has ever gone without reaching at least 60 degrees, and that was in 1951.
5/31	Mother Nature saturated the area with rain and hail for the 2 nd straight day Thursday. Late afternoon winds blew again, knocking down trees, and enough rain fell to pop manhole covers. Nearly 2 inches fell in West Salem and Onalaska in 2 hours. But the record for LaCrosse is safe – we're an inch short of the May record of 9.7 inches set 9 years ago.
6/4	The Weather Service says "meteorological spring" was the 2 nd wettest in LaCrosse, with only 1973 being wetter.
6/7	City pools and beaches open tomorrow in LaCrosse, and temps might not get out of the 60s. Hard to get excited with conditions.
