In addressing the needs of our community and the issues facing it, KXVO-TV aired many varied public service announcements and programs during the fourth quarter of 2013. This period covered October 1 - December 31, 2012.

KXVO-TV broadcasts general audience programming, including CW Television Network programs, and “Live” breaking news reports, as events occur, that are of national and local interest or concern.

A Community Calendar airs at various times. Its purpose is to inform the community of events/activities held by non-profit organizations. It is a service utilized by a variety of local causes.

WSI True View Alert system provides up-to-the-minute information about weather changes, and broadcasts warnings and bulletins, as the situation arises.

KXVO-TV also airs the newscast from KPTM-TV. News stories of interest to the community. Program airs between 5-6 am. Due to KPTM-TV news schedule, KXVO-TV only airs 5 newscasts a week.

HEALTH	KPTM 9 O'CLOCK NEWS	10/18/2013	2:00 Min	As the weather cools down, most people turn up their heat. That can lead to carbon monoxide exposure. The Nebraska Medical center has a new oxygen chamber to help treat carbon monoxide patients. A 61 year old man used the chamber after being exposed to the gas while working on a client's home.
		11/8/2013	2:00 Min	Changes in healthcare legislation mean tough choices for some small business owners. A Lincoln told its full time employees they'll no longer be insured through the company. The company has had health care insurance for the past nine years. 45 people will no longer be covered but the move will save current jobs. The day care will pay a penalty for dropping its employee health insurance plan come 2015.
		12/16/2013	2:00 Min	The FDA is asking the companies that make antibacterial soaps and washes to prove the products are safe, and that they're more effective than plain soap and water. The agency says it's revisiting the safety of chemicals used in the products, due to the results of recent studies and new information about the chemicals used.
ECONOMY	KPTM 9 O'CLOCK NEWS	10/1/2013	2:00 Min	A local family is being shut down by the government shut down. A Couple is in the process of moving to DC because her husband was hired as a government service employee almost a year ago. But what they didn't plan for was the shutdown. The family can't pay for bills or its mortgage. The couple has a son who is also a wounded veteran. Funding for his education is also up in the air
		10/10/2013	2:00 Min	People may have fewer options to get the best craft beer if the government shutdown doesn't end. A government agency that gives the green light for new brewing companies to open up may experience delays in the process until members in Washington gets it together.
		11/8/2013	2:00 Min	Omaha is at odds with its fire department. The city is proposing layoffs because the department isn't in within its budget. The city proposed a deal to avoid layoffs if the department cuts some of its paramedic training. The city said it would end layoffs through 2015 if the union agrees to the deal.
ENVIROMENT	KPTM 9 O'CLOCK NEWS	10/4/2013	5:00 Min	A tornado ripped through several Lancaster County towns, leaving a trail of destruction behind. Barns and homes were destroyed in Bennet, Nebraska and a cemetery was heavily damaged due to high winds and flooding in Plattsmouth.
		11/21/2013	2:00 Min	The National Weather Service says it knows snow is coming this winter, but is having a hard time tracking when it is coming to Omaha. They can only track patterns that show the forecast a couple

				of weeks in advance. The climate prediction center doesn't see patterns indicating a warm, cold, wet or dry winter. El Nino or La Nina patterns usually help the national weather service determine what winter will look like.
COMMUNITY PROJECTS	KPTM 9 O'CLOCK NEWS	9/15/2013	1:30 Min	People in Nebraska are doing everything to help Colorado flood victims. People are collecting money to send to volunteers but one store owner in the Old Market is donating supplies and opening a flood relief drop off site. She is from Colorado and her home town was flooded.
		11/3/2013	2:00 Min	The look of the Benson neighborhood has changed. The city has spent thousands of dollars to improve the business district. But one store owner says the construction has caused a 40 percent drop in business. Others say it's not the construction that is scaring off customers. They said it is the areas bad reputation. That is why the city is trying to beautify the area.
		12/17/2013	1:30 Min	The VA is updating veterans within the Omaha area on plans to build a National VA Cemetery. The cemetery will serve 112,000 Veterans, their spouses and eligible dependents in the Omaha area within an approximately 75-mile radius which also includes parts of western Iowa. The initial first phase of construction will provide more than 5,500 gravesites and an early turnover area so that the cemetery can begin burial operations as soon as possible after construction begins.

CRIME	KPTM 9 O'CLOCK NEWS	10/9/2013	2:00 Min	Scammers are cold calling area homes in Plattsmouth claiming they have driven down your home and noticed roof damage from a recent hail storm. But one lady said the only clear view of her home is about 200 feet away. She said the scammers are lying. Legitimate contractors encourage people to make the call to roofing companies if they would like repairs. They suggest never giving any personal information over the phone
		12/13/2013	2:00 Min	A thief broke into a single mother's home and stole all of her daughter's Christmas gifts as well as electronics. Police said you should know when your neighbors work and don't work so they can help keep an eye out on suspicious activity. You should also write down serial numbers for the gifts you buy and make sure the gifts can't be seen through your windows.
		12/17/2013	2:00 Min	A Council Bluffs mother has been arrested for a threatening facebook post. She claims that her son would probably shoot up his high school due to bullying. The family filed a police report about the bullying and claims the school hasn't done anything about it.
AT RISK YOUTH	KPTM 9 O'CLOCK NEWS	11/4/2013	1:30 Min	An Omaha High School launched a student based health center that can help parents who might not be insured. The health center would help prevent and treat illnesses, keep kids in school and it's a cost effective option for lower income families.

		11/6/2013	2:30 Min	Women talk about what attracts girls to gang members. They said money and fame lure girls in. One woman who use to date a gang member now mentors children so they don't make the same mistakes.
		11/8/2013	2:00 Min	Autopsy results show that a teen was killed from overdosing on synthetic marijuana combined with alcohol. Drug experts say banning the drug is becoming harder because drug dealers are switching the chemical makeup once certain chemicals get banned.
POLITICAL	KPTM 9 O'CLOCK NEWS	10/29/2013	2:00 Min	Fremont City Council is discussing changes to an ordinance that bans illegal immigrants from working in Fremont or from renting homes. The council is considering reversing the part of the ordinance about renting to illegal immigrants.
		11/5/2013	3:00 Min	For the first time since 1985 Council Bluffs has a new mayor. City Councilmember Matt Walsh beat Brent Siegrist. He will replace Tom Hanafan. The goal of the next mayor is to develop the downtown area and the community image.
EDUCATION	KPTM 9 O'CLOCK NEWS	10/30/2013	2:00 Min	Millard especially says it's growing too big for its boundaries. The Millard School District is getting too big for its boundaries. That's why the school district is looking at changing school zoning lines to more evenly distribute students. That means some kids could be changing schools.
		11/6/2013	2:00 Min	Omaha Public Schools is looking to make some changes in its absence rules. The revised policy would allow students to miss school for a religious holiday, court appearance, college visit, bereavement and a military deployment of a family member. members and parents say a new policy is needed because the current one is dated. Nebraska's truancy law requires any school to refer students to the county attorney's office if the students have more than 20 absences during a school year.
		11/12/2013	2:00 Min	The Omaha Public School Board is discussing a proposal to raise the student grade requirements for student athletes to a 2.0. Right now most schools follow NSAA guidelines which means student athletes only have to pass four classes. The new proposal would mean students would have to keep at least a C average.
