I. AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE

Saturday News at 6pm – April 17, 2004

Duration: 00:00:36

Pam Smith reported that the Department of Agriculture is seeking one million dollars in penalties against one of the nation's largest kennels. Federal officials are seeking the damages in administrative penalties against Martin Creek Kennel and Pat's Pine Tree Farms near Williford in north Arkansas. The Department says Chester C. Baird, Jr. his wife Patsy, and their daughters routinely violate animal welfare laws. They reportedly failed to provide food, water, shelter or medical care to thousands of dogs and cats. The U.S.D.A. also says it wants to revoke their license to market animals.

News on *Daybreak* - 5-7am – April 22, 2004

Julia Grayson reported that the United States and China have reached several trade agreements during a meeting of the U.S. -China Joint Commission on Commerce and Trade. China pledged to take steps ranging from cracking down on copyright piracy of American movies and computer programs to opening up the country's complicated goods distribution system to foreign firms. Another set of agreements dealt with promises China made to ensure its adoption of new standards for wireless computer and mobile phone transmissions will be fair to U.S. companies.

Saturday News at 6pm – May 6, 2004

Bejal Patel reported that African land snails are swarming Wisconsin and agriculture officials are sweeping the state to collect them. These snails can carry Meningitis and endanger crops. The U.S. Department of Agriculture is trying to figure out how these native African snails ended up in Wisconsin. There have been reports of people giving out the snails for free, as well as people bringing them home from school.

Beth Hunt reported that the upcoming opening of the Clinton Presidential Library is only six months away and the city of Little Rock is hoping to use its opening to bring big business to the Capitol City. November 18 is the planned opening date and for the next few months the Little Rock Regional Chamber of Commerce will be working to lure business prospects in, and hopefully convince them to stay. Matt Largen at the Chamber office is responsible for using the opening week to drive business to Little Rock. "One of the biggest challenges with economic development is just getting people here and once they're here...they love the place. They go crazy for it. This is a way to get people here." Largen is working to bring business prospects in for the event and he's encouraging local businesses to do the same. "It's really important we get our local business leaders in touch with those national business leaders who come for the opening week of the library." Some say it's an opportunity neither the city nor the state took advantage of more than a decade ago when President Bill Clinton ran for office. "We had an opportunity then and we let it slip through our hands and we're not going to do that again." Many of those visitors happen to be former campaign volunteers who will be back in town this year by the hundreds. "Some have gone on to be CEOs, CFOs, COOs, Marketing Managers of major companies and therefore, have great Arkansas connections and they'll be coming back for the grand opening." Matt Largen there has already been about a billion dollars worth of development in downtown Little Rock and the library hasn't even

opened yet. By the way, the latest edition of Forbes Magazine ranks Little Rock 21st on its list of the country's 150 best metropolitan areas for business.

Saturday News at 6pm - May 29, 2004

Pam Smith reported that the Minnesota Commerce Department fined El Dorado-based Murphy Oil Company \$70,000. Arkansas adopted a law requiring gas to be sold at least 8-cents a gallon more than the company paid for it. Murphy's gas is sold at most Wal-Mart stores. Kwik Trip, Inc. was also fined \$5,000 for several violations.

II. CONSUMER AND LABOR

News at 6pm – April 5, 2004

Jason Pederson reported that the best way to prevent fire deaths is to have an effective warning system and escape plan. Last summer we took a prototype of the Kismart Vocal Smoke Detector to Conway and tested it with the Wells family. “(beep) (whirr, whirr) Maggie, Katie, get up. There’s a fire in the house. Stick to our plan. Go down the stairs, stay low, and meet us by the front door. (beep, beep).” Both girls woke up, although they didn’t spring right out of bed. Conway’s Fire Marshall was going to reserve judgement until more testing had been completed. Victoria University in Australia has tested the device and found that 100% of the kids tested woke up when hearing their mother’s voice, 92% woke up when hearing the pre-recorded voice of an actress, and only 57% woke up to an alarm only. The Consumer Product Safety Commission is currently testing not only voice alarms but also interconnected alarms - meaning when one alarm in the house goes off they all go off as well as strobe light alarms. According to the company’s website the voice alarms are finally for sale. They are \$70 dollars each but orders won’t be shipped until the end of the month. News on Live at 5 – April 15, 2004

Krista Platzter reported that obesity is poised to overtake smoking as the leading cause of death in the United States. Now some fast food restaurants are joining in the battle of the bulge. Nearly 65%, that’s about 127 million adults now are considered overweight or obese. Under pressure from the government and consumer groups, the biggest of all burger chains is joining the fight to help America shape up. “This plan is focused on more menu choices, supporting increased physical activity, and education to encourage healthier American lifestyles.” McDonald’s is introducing an Adult Happy Meal, which contains a salad, bottled water, and a pedometer to keep track of physical activity. A kid’s version will follow offering the choice of apples and low fat caramel dip and juice or milk instead of fries and soda.

News at 6pm – May 25, 2004

Kate Sullivan reported that the state plans to save money next year by shutting down a Mental Health Division called the Arkansas Partnership Program. Supporters of the program appealed to the Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor today. They argue this service is the only hope for rehabilitating patients who commit violent crimes because of mental problems or drug and alcohol abuse. Susan Bassinger Sweet worries about her brother Ken. “It scares me to death that he might be let loose on the street. He might be hurt, or one of your children might be hurt. He does not mean to, he’s a large giant.” The Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor said “it’s a matter of money. We no longer have the money to provide all the services we’ve been providing. We had to make cuts somewhere, and we believe we can get these people the same service for less money by going to other programs.” Many of the 41 patients will be moved to facilities in Corning and to other state hospitals. Critics say these violent patients are going to facilities that are not secure. The state will save 3-million dollars by eliminating the program here in Little Rock.

Julia Grayson reported that the Attorney General is sending out a warning on the new Medicare prescription drug discount cards. Con artists are selling bogus cards over the phone and door-to-

door, targeting older consumers. The new Medicare card has been available since June 1 and Attorney General Mike Beebe urges you to be aware and remember that drug discount cards that have been approved will carry a Medicare approval seal. You can check if the card is legitimate by calling 1-800-Medicare. Plus, all approved discount cards will cost no more than \$30 a year. Krista Platzer reported in tonight's *Family First* that identity theft, an ever-increasing threat for all of us, could cost you thousands of dollars, not to mention damage your credit rating. Interestingly, teenagers are more vulnerable than others. The far-reaching effects of identity theft create countless hurdles to overcome. While everyone is at risk, teenagers are being singled out and that's why parents need to help kids protect themselves. Suzanne Boas, President, Consumer Credit Counseling Service said, "It is frightening to think what can happen to you when someone gets a hold of your identity. If they've manage to get a hold of your social security number and take out credit card applications in your name – that may go on for months before you realize it and it may actually take you years to resolve the problem. You may have difficulty getting a job where a credit report is required. You may have trouble renting an apartment. You may have trouble leasing a car. You may have all sorts of difficulties that you can't even imagine now." Teenagers are a perfect target because by virtue of their age they've got an unblemished credit report to begin with. Parents must help kids protect themselves. Boas says, "First and foremost, leave your social security card at home. Secondly, make sure you protect your credit cards all the time as well as your checkbook. Don't take them when you're going out partying. And third, be smart when buying online – only use your credit card in a secure website." Knowing the risks is the first step in protecting your identity and your financial future. If you think you've been a victim of identity theft experts say the first step is to call police, second, call whomever sent you a bill with fraudulent charges, and lastly, call a credit bureau, and the Federal Trade Commission.

III. CRIME AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE

News on *Daybreak* - 5-7am – April 8, 2004

Kate Sullivan reported that the owners of a popular menswear store are doubly frustrated ... in two weeks they have been burglarized twice with more than \$30,000 in clothing stolen, and now they want the thieves caught. The owners of Mr. Wick's take great pride in their high-end merchandise and customer service. So, when a thief busted open their door and stole thousands of dollars worth of clothing they were naturally upset. Then only ten days later it happened again. "In the first incident the thieves used a crow bar and the second time the thieves just kicked the door in and made his way over to the pricey Samuelson suits and colorful Bugatchi shirts." The police think these two burglaries are related because they came back and there was a certain area of the store hit both times. "We feel we've had these people in the store and they have surveyed the scene and they knew what they wanted and what they wanted to sell. And they knew exactly what they wanted to take." In 44 years of business Mr. Wick's has rarely had to face this kind of crime – and now they have had it happen twice in a matter of only 10 days. "We're going to put up gates and a surveillance system." If you have any information about the burglaries, you could be eligible for a reward of up to \$1,000.00. News on *Daybreak* - 5-7am – April 13, 2004

Beth Hunt reported that it's out with the old and in with the new as several houses in Pine Bluff are demolished to make way for a new county jail. County residents approved a half-cent sales tax increase last year to build the new jail and demolition work for the 11-million dollar project is underway. The county judge says he's hoping the new facility will save the county money in the long run. Right now Jefferson County shares their facility with the Department of Correction. With only 106 beds, inmates are having to be shipped elsewhere those costs are starting to add up. County Judge Jones says the new jail will have 304 beds and with the existing 106 beds, the county will have over 400 beds available for inmates. "We're going to have a place to lock people up and hopefully won't be putting them back on the street where they can commit more crime." The Jefferson County Quorum Court as has appropriated an additional \$89,000 to buy extra land for the new jail and the new 11-million dollar facility is expected to be complete by July 2006.

News on *Live at 5pm* – May 3, 2004

Kate Sullivan reported that more than 30 guns and a large amount of drugs were uncovered in a Benton home. Police arrested and charged 54-year-old James Holden last night, after more than a yearlong investigation. Authorities seized 36 guns, various drugs including methamphetamine, Ecstasy, and ice, more than \$100,000 in cash, and a Dodge truck used to transport drugs. Police say there were seven people in Holden home at the time of the arrest, including a 12-year-old child. Holden is facing various charges that carry a penalty of up to 40 years in prison. "The home is located in a drug-free zone as there's a Catholic school right down the street. So any drug charges would carry an enhancement penalty of 10 years in prison where they have to serve 100% of the time on the enhancement charge if they're found guilty." Police also arrested 52-year-old Mickel Bodiford for possession of a controlled substance. Charges are pending against two others that were in the home.

News on *Nightside* at 10pm – May 10, 2004

Kate Sullivan reported on the “Body Farm” in the hills of Knoxville, Tennessee. It is a place where the dead help the living. Hundreds of police officers across Arkansas work crime scenes everyday and the first question most officers ask is, “what happened?” That is the question the “Body Farm” is helping officers learn to answer. There is only one place like it in the world - where dead bodies lie exposed on the ground - all in the name of science. It sounds morbid, and it is. But the work that goes on at the body farm is nothing short of inspirational. The man behind the “Body Farm” is Dr. Bill Bass, a professor at the University of Tennessee Knoxville, and one of the pioneers of modern forensic science. What a forensic scientist needs to know is so much more than the basics that are found in textbooks. So, Dr. Bass secured an acre of land near the University of Tennessee Knoxville and gave life to the “Body Farm.” “What we have done at the ‘Body Farm’ is to establish the sequence that occurs at death, which every dead body goes through, fresh, bloat, decay.” Anytime a body is found, at any stage of decomposition, Dr. Bass wants to be able to tell police - with certainty when that person was killed. “I never see a case as a dead body, I see it as a puzzle - here's a puzzle can solve it and tell who it is and what happened to them.” At any given time dozens of bodies are scattered across the lot, decaying in controlled experiments. The bodies are mostly unclaimed and unidentified. Most have been donated. “We’ve put bodies in the shade, sun, clothed, no clothed, trunks of cars, inside of automobiles.” Each experiment revealing more about how a body decays. “Cadaver dogs will smell around the edge of the concrete slab.” In one corner Bass and his team of scientists study how cadaver dogs know what they're looking for. “We don't know what the cadaver dog is zeroing in on as a body decays we don't know what that smell is.” To some, this scene may appear inhumane or even disrespectful. But Dr. Bass says the contribution of these corpses have helped solve hundreds of murder cases and given closure to grieving families. They are people helping humanity even after death. Dr. Bill Bass living in a world of lifeless limbs, says he’s grateful for his grave situation. “I like to help people and I went into this field not for the excitement, but to help people.” I think I need to pay back society for letting me do something that I like - society is paying me to do this.” Hundreds of students have gone through Dr. Bass' program at the “Body Farm.”

IV. DEFENSE AND VETERAN AFFAIRS (Secretary of State)

News on *Nightside* at 10pm – April 7, 2004

Duration: 00:00:30

Kate Sullivan reported that heavy fighting continued in Iraq tonight. Defense Secretary Donald Rumsfeld called the violence the work of gangs and terrorists. He says some U.S. troops who were set to leave the war-torn country may have to stay longer to deal with the uprisings. In another development today, U.S. forces dropped a 500-pound bomb on a mosque, where witnesses said up to 40 people were killed.

News on *Nightside* at 10pm – May 9, 2004

Beejal Patel reported on a tribute to fallen Arkansas soldiers in McRae. Members of the 39th Infantry Brigade left for Iraq in march.. Since then, seven Arkansas National Guard soldiers have been killed in action and one McRae man is hoping his memorial will help Arkansans remember those soldiers who have paid the ultimate sacrifice. On the front lawn of the Veterans' Memorial in McRae there are five white crosses, each with the name of a fallen Arkansas soldier from the War in Iraq. On the weekend of April 24, after learning five Arkansas soldiers were killed, Buck Griffith was determined to send a message to their families, and so he built this memorial. Griffith plans to put up two more crosses in honor of Sergeant William Labadie who was killed by gunfire in April, and Staff Sergeant Hesley Box, Jr., killed three days ago, by a car bomb. Griffith has ten more crosses he is painting, but he hopes they never get used. A star above the Veterans Memorial in McRae with 900 white lights will remained lit until members of the 39th Infantry Brigade come home. Right now, almost 2,900 soldiers from that unit are serving in Iraq.

News on *Nightside* at 10 p.m. – June 19, 2004

Pam Smith reported live from New Orleans on the journey of the U.S.S. Razorback submarine from Turkey to Arkansas. The submarine is now in New Orleans on the last leg of a two-month voyage to North Little Rock, making it the only U.S. city to own a vessel of this type. Dozens of veterans have come to reflect on a cause which thousands of their comrades sacrificed their lives. "History is the whole thing. Yesterday's history is tomorrow's future. If you don't pick up on it, you'll miss the point." Commissioned in 1944, the Razorback is the last operational submarine, which was present in Tokyo and took part in the formal surrender of Japan after WWII. It was decommissioned and sold to Turkey in 1970. Negotiations to secure it for North Little Rock began two years ago. The submarine will be the centerpiece of a soon-to-be-built Maritime Museum in North Little Rock. After some additional restoration, the U.S.S. Razorback will navigate its way up the Mississippi and into the Arkansas River July 18. Channel Seven will continue tracking the voyage along the way.

V. EDUCATION AND YOUTH

News on *Live at 5* – April 2, 2004

Beth Hunt reported that the Special Masters released their findings as to whether the legislature did its job in overhauling the public school system. Bradley Jesson and David Newbern were named by the Supreme Court to review the legislature's work and they handed in their report just hours ago. In a 128-page report, the Supreme Court Masters say Arkansas has yet to fully define what constitutes an adequate public school education. Masters Bradley Jesson and David Newbern have been reviewing the state's actions to a 2002 Supreme Court decision that found Arkansas' public school system unconstitutional. The Special Masters gave no specific recommendations to the court regarding issues such as consolidation or teacher pay. Governor Huckabee held a news conference late this afternoon and here's what he had to say about the report. "I think the report made it clear that unless you have efficiency, you're never going to get to the point of adequacy or equity." The Masters pointed out in their report that Arkansas' education officials have not decided what is required for an adequate education. In addition, they saw a point in the Lake View School District's argument about unbalanced teacher salaries, but did not recommend more school consolidation. Now it is up to the court, which will have the challenge to determine what recommendations they should make to the General Assembly as well as the Board of Education.

Kate Sullivan reported that it looked like the Prize Patrol in some Little Rock schools today when the Public Education Foundation of Little Rock made the rounds to nineteen different schools surprising teachers with big checks. The money comes from the Foundation's Innovative Ideas Grant Program. Lieutenant Governor Win Rockefeller and Little Rock Mayor Jim Dailey were among the officials riding along from school to school. One teacher at Jefferson Elementary received a grant for \$4,600 dollars. The grants will be used to help a teacher better fund an existing project he or she is working on.

News at 6pm – May 14, 2004

U.S. Secretary of Education Rod Paige was in Little Rock today to mark the 50th Anniversary of the Supreme Court decision to desegregate schools in America. Paige addressed students at Little Rock's Central High School, which of course was the site of the historic desegregation fight back in 1957. Paige says Central's desegregation was a milestone along a difficult and continuing struggle for racial equality that began with the 1954 ruling.

News on *Live at 5* – June 18, 2004

Michelle Rupp reported that the Arkansas State Supreme Court ends a 12-year lawsuit that has led to major reforms of the state's public school system. In a 4 to 3 decision, justices said the legislature has adequately changed the course of problems facing a system the court declared unconstitutional just two years ago. Governor Huckabee talked to reporters this morning saying there are no obvious answers in this case, and the deep division among the justices reflects that. "In a way the fact that the court was so clearly divided, a 4/3 decision is as split as it could be, indicates they struggled with this clearly as did the legislature, the public and that I did." In the majority opinion, written by Justice Robert L. Brown, it clarified the court hasn't wavered in its effort to make sure the state's school system is equally and sufficiently funded. However, Brown wrote that the process of

fixing the system would take years. In the 31-page opinion the court praised lawmakers for their work in changing the education funding system. In the dissenting opinion, written by Justice Tom Glaze, he wrote, "One must keep in mind that, even as of today's decision, no court, including this court, has held the state's public school funding system constitutional." We certainly are grateful that the courts acknowledge that some progress has been made. The other thing is they realize a great deal more progress is yet to be done." We did attempt to reach the Lake View attorneys in this case however our calls were not returned. What does today's decision mean for the future of consolidation? We'll tell you tonight on Channel 7 News at 6 p.m.

VI. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

News on Live at 5 p.m. – April 17, 2004

Krista Platzer reported in tonight's *Family First Report* that next week marks Arkansas Children's Week and today Governor Huckabee reiterated how important it is that kids need to start school ready to learn as well as the State's commitment to providing the best education for Arkansas students. It's called *Getting Ready for School*, and it's a commitment to Arkansas families. "To put it in perspective, 22,297 three and four year olds need help getting ready for school because they fall below the Federal poverty level. The numbers are startling -- that's why the State is committing 40-million new dollars for pre-kindergarten and early education. "Because they understand that if we work with kids when they are young we can make a difference -- especially those that come from high poverty areas of the state." Research shows when kids have a strong education foundation -- they're more likely to succeed not only in school but also in life. "When we talk getting ready for school we're not talking about oatmeal and a sweater." What they are talking about is determining if children are "ready" to learn, and then tracking their progress. "We're not just taking, we're constantly evaluating to ensure meeting benchmarks of success." The publication identifies four areas: Ready Children, Ready Families, Ready Schools and Ready Communities. The four areas will be tracked on a county and state level in an effort to address the evolving educational needs of the state. News at 6 p.m. – June 12, 2004

Scott Inman reported that state health officials today are starting an aggressive testing program for the West Nile Virus. Every county in the state will test dead blue jays and crows for any signs of the virus. Last year, Arkansas had 26 human cases of West Nile Virus, but no one died from it. Experts say they cannot predict the outlook this season, but hotter temperatures generally lead to a worse West Nile season. The best prevention is to get rid of standing water around your home, avoid going outside during dawn and dusk, and use insect repellent with the chemical DEET.

News on *Nightside* at 10pm – June 7, 2004

Christian McLarty reported that the father of a teenager involved in a reported kidnapping and assault is upset, and speaking out tonight. You may remember the story - last Thursday night witnesses say three suspects abducted 13-year-old Franklin Fortney, Jr. at gunpoint. Fortney was injured but is okay. New on *Nightside*, Franklin's father, who does not have custody of his son, says he worries about his son's current living situation. The teen's father, Frank Fortney tells me his son is in DHS custody living in a foster home. He adds his son was unable to flee when the suspects approached him. "From my understanding, his foster parents had locked him out of the house." Frank says he was outraged to hear of the crime his son faced here at an I-630 overpass. It's where police say Frank, Jr. was threatened with a gun and kidnapped. Frank adds the event has traumatized his son. "I'm angry, he was not being supervised and should have been monitored more closely." DHS officials cannot confirm whether Frank, Jr. is in their custody, but reveal what they look for when monitoring or investigating a foster home. "So we see if the parents are acting appropriately and taking care of the child." If they don't find the right answers there are consequences such as placing them in another home or even revoking their license as a parent depending on how serious it is. "They put him in another home one mile from where he was abducted so that concerns me." It's a concern that Frank says will continue to consume his thoughts because his son's future is at stake. "Teens can be volatile, it can be difficult and to find a

placement for them and especially of a teen with emotional baggage of their biological family.”
Police say they are still investigating the assault and kidnapping, but have made no arrests.

VII. POLITICS (Treasury, Housing, Urban Development)

News at 6 p.m. – April 28, 2004

Pam Smith reported that hundreds of people turned out for a chance at public housing assistance in Little Rock. It was a scene that quickly turns ugly when too many applicants hope for too few slots. Many had camped outside the locked gates at Barton Coliseum overnight, only to learn they would not make it past this fence. "This lets everybody know see how bad the economy is. These are a thousand people that have been out here since 5 a.m." All with a singular purpose – a chance for their names to be among the lucky 250 selected for a waiting list for public housing. The Little Rock Housing Authority advertised the event in the newspaper, but could not predict how many would turn out. That is no excuse say the angry ones who were turned away. "They made no attempts to organize this at all, even though yesterday they had three fights out here." According to some it was dangerously close to reaching violence again Wednesday as crowds hoping to be the first through the gates pressed into them. Some children were even nearly in harm's way. "Their parents fell in, so they had to pass their children to them." Police eventually arrived and dispersed the crowd to prevent an already chaotic situation from becoming deadly. "If they can't see what the problem is now, it's sad for all of us. These people are innocent, this is public housing that caused this uproar, not these people, they're innocent people." By noon, exhausted from that uproar, many sat dazed, wondering what would be next. Unsatisfied with the answers they got and the way they say they were treated. "All she said was this isn't that serious. I want her to stand on this side of the fence and say it's not that serious. I want her to look into the eyes of her children and say it's not that serious." We're told the confusion was a result of someone in the crowd who decided to form a waiting list that housing officials did not authorize nor recognize. There is no word when pre-applications will be accepted again. Our frequent calls to housing officials went unreturned today.

Beth Hunt reported about the upcoming opening of the Clinton Presidential Library. It's being called the biggest international event in Arkansas history, and it is only six months away. The City of Little Rock is hoping to use its opening to bring big business to the Capitol City. November 18 is the planned opening date, and for the next few months the Little Rock Regional Chamber of Commerce will be working to lure business prospects in, and hopefully convince them to stay. There are 191 days until the library opens – the countdown is on - especially for Matt Largen at the Little Rock Regional Chamber of Commerce. His job is to use the opening week to drive business development for the area. "One of the biggest challenges with economic development is just getting people here and once they're here they love the place. They go crazy for it. This is a way to get people here." Largen is working to bring business prospects in for the event, and he's encouraging local businesses to do the same. "It's really important we get our local business leaders in touch with those national business leaders who come for the opening week of the library." Some say it's an opportunity neither the city nor the state took advantage of more than a decade ago when Bill Clinton ran for president. "We had an opportunity then, but we let it slip through our hands and we're not going to do that again." Many of those visitors happen to be former campaign volunteers who will be back in town this year by the hundreds. "Some have gone on to be CEOs, CFOs, COOs, Marketing Managers of major companies and therefore, have great Arkansas connections. They'll be coming back for the grand opening." Matt Largen says there has already been about a billion dollars worth of development in downtown Little Rock and the library hasn't even opened

yet. By the way, the latest edition of Forbes Magazine has Little Rock ranked number 21st on its list of the country's 150 best metropolitan areas for business.

It's just fascinating to watch. You can see the coals glowing back here with the anvil going. It's neat." The Folk Center's roots reach back to the beginning of the Ozark Folk Festival in the 1960's. It is now America's only facility that works to preserve Ozark heritage and present it in a colorful and entertaining way. "If you want to hear how the folks originally learned to play music here in the Ozarks, this is the place to do it, because they still maintain the instruments. It's just the kind of stuff that many of our grandparents grew up with. While at the Folk Center you can see more than 20 traditional pioneer skills being displayed. Nearby are Blanchard Springs Caverns, trout fishing on the White River and many other fun activities. In fact, there's so much to do you may want to spend the night in the comfortable Dry Creek Lodge.

in thousands of visitors each year to see the sights, hear the sounds, and of course, taste the food of the festival. “You can get everything from an alligator on a stick to a corn dog, to something new this year, fried Snickers. Along with lots of things with tomatoes.” The festivities in Warren will wrap up tonight with a variety of live music. This year’s event also received national television attention – The Food Network has been covering the festival this week and the segment will air in about six months.

Here in Little Rock in 1999, American Airlines Flight 1420 crashed while landing in a severe thunderstorm and 11 people were killed.

African American men lead the nation in all cancer deaths and African American women are 43% more likely to die from breast cancer as opposed to white women. The Cancer Society attributes this to minorities having little or no health insurance, poverty and a lack of access to health information and services. With this in mind, this is National Minority Cancer Awareness Week. Today, it was kicked off in Arkansas at Philander Smith College in Little Rock. We want to help change these statistics. News on *Daybreak* – 7-9 a.m. – May 4, 2004

Michelle Rupp reported that there are now several new ways for thousands of Arkansans on Medicare to pay for their medicine. As of yesterday, seniors and the disabled can sign up for new prescription drug cards. It's strictly on a volunteer basis. If seniors like their health plan or coverage, they don't have to change a thing. Those who do will have a nearly 30 choices. "There's still no rush we still have plenty of time to get them a card, it doesn't start until June 1." For seniors on a budget these reforms could bring some relief. However, pharmacists are strongly advising their customers to consult someone they trust before making a decision because once a plan is decided upon, you can't make changes and in some cases these cards might not be the best answer. "If you've retired or your spouse is retired and you're getting benefits on medications from that, it may be a lot better than this card will be, and you may not even want that card." These cards will be in effect until the end of the year. At that time, you would have the option to change. Pharmacists add not all of the cards will be accepted in Arkansas.

News on *Live at 5 p.m.* – June 22, 2004

Christina Muñoz reported on a federal judge giving the go-ahead for a sex-discrimination lawsuit against Arkansas-based Wal Mart. It's the largest private civil rights suit in U.S. history. The suit will cover more than one million women nationwide and contends that female Wal Mart employees were treated unfairly. The creates a class of up to 1.6 million current and former female employees, making it the largest employment discrimination lawsuit against a U.S. company. Just two weeks ago at Wal Mart's Shareholder's Meeting in Fayetteville, President and CEO Lee Scott promised to live up to diversity expectations regarding minorities and women. Today a Federal Judge in California granted class-action status to a discrimination lawsuit brought against the world's largest retailer. The suit was originally brought by six San Francisco women three years ago, who allege that Wal Mart treats women unfairly in terms of pay and promotion. At the Shareholders Meeting, the company's president said Wal Mart has been working to promote more women and minorities to deter a number of discrimination lawsuits pending against the company. "What I'm saying is Lee Scott's salary next year will be reduced, not salary but bonus potential will be reduced 15% if we do not live up to our diversity expectations, that's putting your money where you mouth is." Wal Mart representatives say they disagree with the judge's decision and do plan to appeal. Coming up tonight at 6 p.m., we'll have more on Wal Mart's response to the lawsuit.
