Program: On Delmarva

Airs: Sunday mornings 6-6:30am

ISSUE: Community Involvement

Airdate: Sunday, July 2

Spoke with Ryan Weitzel, organizer of the Red, White and Boom 4th of July Event. This annual fireworks display is set at James M. Bennett High School in Salisbury, MD. Ryan highlighted the schedule for the night and spoke about some of the food truck vendors that would be in attendance.

Airdate: Sunday, August 6

Spoke with Zach Evans from the Wicomico County Fair set to take place August 17-20 at Winterplace Park in Salisbury, MD. Once again, the event will feature a pageant, fireworks on Friday night, the Maryland High School Rodeo, animal exhibits, bounce houses, 4-H competitions, food, crafters and live entertainment.

ISSUE: Housing

Airdate: Sunday, July 9

Spoke with Lauren Hitch, host of the Delmarva Home Show. This NEW online program was set to feature unique homes on Delmarva, as well as some historical locations and Bed & Breakfast establishments. The real estate show would highlight interesting homes on Delmarva. In the future, the show may be broadcast on local TV stations.

ISSUE: Community Heritage Airdate: Sunday, July 16

Spoke with Holly Porter of the Delmarva Chicken Association about the Delmarva Chicken Festival. This event was retired in 2014, but they are bringing it back for one year only to highlight the 100th anniversary of the chicken meat industry on Delmarva. The one-day festival will take place Saturday, October 7th from 1-7pm at Arthur W. Perdue Stadium in Salisbury, MD and will feature vendors, crafters, food, entertainment, amusements, a chicken wing eating contest and a pageant.

Airdate: Sunday, September 10

Spoke with Andy Nunez, local author and storyteller about his recent Pirates of the Eastern Shore book which tells legends and tales of pirates and buried treasure on Delmarva. We also spoke about his upcoming Ghosts 4 of the Eastern Shore which covers true encounters of paranormal activity on Delmarva, as well as local ghost stories and legends.

ISSUE: Veteran Assistance Airdate: Sunday, July 23

Spoke with Brandon and Steve from the Irreverent Warriors Foundation about their upcoming Silkies Hike. This event is open to veterans. It is a run/walk to increase awareness of veteran suicide. This event was set to take place in Rehoboth, DE.

Spoke with Donte London from Move 4 Life and their upcoming 5K Run/Walk. Move 4 Life is a non-profit organization that helps low-income families stay physically fit. The organization provides a means to workout, participate in fitness classes and more. The Run/walk would be one of their big fundraisers. The event also features a fitness competition. It was set to take place in Federalsburg, MD on September 9th.
