Fatal Crash in Martin County

MARTIN COUNTY, TX – Early on Saturday morning, a fatal crash involving two semi-trucks occurred in Martin County.

According to Texas DPS, Troopers responded to the 2-vehicle crash at 2:59 AM on FM 829, 10 miles north of Lenorah. The preliminary information revealed that Emmanuel Kayode Omotoso, 47, of Midland, was traveling northbound on FM 829 when for unknown reasons, Omotoso veered into the southbound lane and struck another semi-truck traveling southbound. The southbound semi-truck was driven by Eulicer Pupo Rodriguez, 56, of Odessa.

Rodriguez was pronounced deceased at the scene. The preliminary information stated that he did not have a seatbelt on at the time of the crash. Omotoso was wearing a seatbelt during the crash. He was transported to Midland Memorial Hospital in stable condition.

This crash remains under investigation at this time.

Fatal Crash in Howard County

HOWARD COUNTY, TX – Early on Friday June 30th, a fatal crash involving a 2019 Ford F-150 and a semi-truck with a trailer occurred in Howard County.

Troopers responded to the crash at 7:42 AM on HWY 350, 20 miles from Big Spring. The preliminary information revealed that the semi truck, driven by Israel Reyna Castro, 33, of Glendale, AZ, was traveling northbound on HWY 350 when for unknown reasons, he veered into the southbound lane and struck the Ford F-150 traveling southbound. The southbound passenger truck was driven by Vernon Brady Doggett, 22, of Moran, TX.

Doggett was pronounced deceased at the scene. Castro was transported to Scenic Mountain Medical Center in stable condition.

This crash remains under investigation at this time.

<u>Arson Suspected in Dora Roberts Community Center Fire:</u>

Yesterday afternoon, Big Spring Fire Marshal Dan Hendrickson announced that a recent fire at the Dora Roberts Community Center is being investigated as Arson.

On July 1, 2023, at 4:45 a.m. the Howard County Dispatch Center received a call for a possible structure fire at the Dora Roberts Community Center (DRCC). The first unit arrived on scene at 4:50 a.m. to find the building fully involved. The fire department responded with two fire trucks, a ladder truck, a medic unit, and command staff. Despite their best efforts, the building was a total loss. Crews cleared the scene and went back in service at 12:15 p.m.

Due to suspicious circumstances, the Big Spring Fire Marshal's office is investigating this incident as Arson, third-degree felony. The Big Spring Fire Marshal's Office is working in conjunction with the Big Spring Police Department and the ATF (Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives). This is an ongoing investigation, and there is no other information currently.

Fire Marshal Hendrickson advised that they are continuing to ask the public to stay away from the DRCC; it is dangerous and illegal to trespass onto the property.

He went on to state that this facility was important to our community, and they are asking the community for help in finding the person(s) responsible for this crime. Items on today's agenda include a discussion on a possible action on public nuisance abatement procedures, and an indigent burial cremation proposal.

Texas Man Sentenced to 90 Consecutive Life Sentences for Mass Shooting in El Paso EL PASO, Texas – Last week, a Texas man was sentenced in a federal court in El Paso to 90 consecutive life sentences in prison for killing 23 people and injuring 22 more in a mass shooting at an El Paso Walmart, Aug. 3, 2019.

According to court documents, Patrick Wood Crusius, 24, was convicted on a guilty plea to a 90-count superseding indictment with 45 counts of violating the Matthew Shepard and James Byrd Jr. Hate Crimes Prevention Act, and 45 counts of using a firearm during and in relation to crimes of violence. Crusius admitted that his crimes were directed at Hispanics because of their perceived race and national origin and were motivated by his desire to initiate a race war.

Over a period of months, the defendant meticulously planned and carefully prepared to commit his crimes, detailing the plan and its purpose in a manifesto he crafted and posted on the internet moments before initiating the attack on the victims and the El Paso community.

After receiving statements from some of the victims, their family members and loved ones, the court imposed 90 consecutive life sentences. Under federal law, a sentence of life imprisonment is without the possibility of parole and ends only upon the prisoner's death. Accordingly, this sentence ensures Crusius will spend the rest of his natural life in prison.

Crusius was also sentenced for 22 counts of hate crime acts that caused bodily injury and involved attempts to kill the 22 people injured in the shooting.

In addition to the hate crimes, Crusius was sentenced for 45 firearms violations, 23 counts of using a firearm in a federal crime of violence resulting in death, and 22 counts of using a firearm in a federal crime of violence.

Motorcycle Collides with Wrecker in Big Spring

A fatal motorcycle accident occurred in Big Spring last week. According to the Big Spring Police Department, on the 3rd of July 2023 at approximately 3:45 PM, BSPD officers responded to the 2600 block of S. Hwy 87 in regards to a major accident. Upon arrival a motorcyclist, Robert Howland 52 years of age, was found to be deceased. The preliminary investigation indicates a Orange and White Peterbilt wrecker owned by Crossroads Wrecking had been traveling southbound and attempting a U-turn in an attempt to turn back northbound when a 2016 Black Harley Davidson, that was also traveling southbound, collided into the wrecker. Howland was not wearing a helmet at the time of the accident. This accident is still under investigation with the assistance of the Department of Public Safety.
