1. Teen Kids News

Target Audience: Ages 13 years to 16 years

First kid-to-kid newscast, created for and delivered by children. Hosted by a diverse news team made up of child "journalists" reporting from a professional news set. Meets the needs of children whose sophistication and curiosity about their world is motivated by the information explosion. Delivered eye-to-eye with a pre-adolescent sensibility and sense of humor. Emphasis on diversity and experience.

2. Exploration with Richard Wiese

Target Audience: Ages 13 years to 16 years

"Exploration with Richard Wiese is a half-hour live action television program designed to meet the educational and informational needs of children. In each episode, cameras follow the host to the nearest and farthest corners of the world as he explores the land, the air and the sea with intrepid curiosity. An experienced science journalist, Richard Wiese has the experience and credentials to introduce children to places, peoples and things they may never have seen before. The producers design each episode to reveal to children the world around them in a way that identifies positive role models and pro-social values within an environmentally responsible universe.

3. Jack Hanna's Animal Adventures Target Audience: Ages 13 years to 16 years

"Jack Hanna's Animal Adventures" is a half-hour action television program designed to meet the educational and informational needs of children. In each episode, the cameras follow Jack as he spends time with nature's creatures across the continents. Jack talks with people that are knowledgeable about each animal and habitat, teaching as he goes. Each episode is designed to reveal to children the world around them in a way that presents positive role models and prosocial values within an environmentally responsible universe.

4. Critter Gitters

Target Audience: Ages 9 years to 14 years

"Critter Gitters" is a half-hour live action television program created to meet the educational and informational needs of children. Each show contains educational material and information about science, animals, biology and geography, while the Critter Gitters solve ethical dilemmas that face children in everyday life.

5. Beakman's World

Target Audience: Ages 13 years to 16 years

Beakman's World is a 30 minute television program designed to further the educational and informational needs of children. The entire series deals with science and the task of making science accessible and understandable to them.

6. Beakman's World (alternate episode)

Target Audience: Ages 13 years to 16 years

Beakman's World is a 30 minute television program designed to further the educational and informational needs of children. The entire series deals with science and the task of making science accessible and understandable to them.

12:30p-1:00p: Exploration with Richard Wiese: Episode 202 - Living with a Volcano in your Backyard

Richard will be hiking, climbing, and investigating the geography of Mt. Rainier. From green hills, to snow covered heights, this volcanic mountain even creates its own weather. Richard will investigate the wildlife and terrain of this active volcano in Washington State.

1:00p-1:30p: Jack Hanna's Animal Adventures: Episode 2250 - "Lake Manyara"

In the Great Rift Valley to Tanzania, Jack explores Lake Manyara National Park, a small park with an incredible wealth of wildlife. 1:30p-2:00p: Critter Gitters: Episode 303- "The Dingy Dilemma"

Word comes back from the dolphins that the professor's DINGY is malfunctioning and causing chaos in the seas. The Critter Gitters head back to the drop site, but are hindered by an approaching hurricane. True to form, the professor comes through with the latest in underwater transportation technology. In the end, it is the simple courageous act of a little girl that saves the day.

Nick and Annie finally get their chance t do what they had come to Florida for in the first place: search for the mystical manatees. Their quest leads them on an adventure through the untamed wilderness. Aided by clues from Mr. Belcher, and a wayward hermit, they make their way up Crystal River. When they find themselves surrounded by Alligators, the professor picks them up in his amazing new Seair Flying boat. It is from this vantage point in the sky that they find what they were looking for.

2:00p-2:30p: Beakman's World: Episode 104 - Blood, Beak Mania & Dreams

Once again the Critter Gitters spring into action, diving and swimming heroically underwater in a breathtaking finale, rescuing the drowning turtles.

2:00p-2:30p: Beakman's World: Episode 105 - Leaves, Beak Mania & Paper
Beakman, as vegetation chef Chlora Phyll, describes how plants "eat;" demonstrates how to recycle your own paper; and answers lingering questions such as "What is escargot?"

2:30p-3:00p: Beakman's World (B): Episode 405 - The Mouth, Beakmania & Sizing & Scale
Beakman belts out a lot of hot air about stinky breath. Then the science crew wiggles their way into the world of slimy worms. Finally, Beakman gives us the secret strengths behind the mathematics of size and scale.

12:00p-12:30p: Teen Kids News: Episode 4-06

Kid-to-kid newscast, created for and delivered by children. Hosted by a diverse news team made up of child "journalists" reporting from a professional news set. Meets the needs of children whose sophistication and curiosity about their world is motivated by the information explosion. Delivered eye-to-eye with a pre-adolescent sensibility and sense of humor. Emphasis on diversity and experience.

12:30p-1:00p: Exploration with Richard Wiese: Episode 112 - "Into Thin Air"

Richard travels to Mesa Verde to explore the abandoned cliff side dwellings of an early tribe of ancient Native Americans who vanished into thin air. By inspecting the different structures and evidence left behind by the mysterious tribe, Richard comes to his own conclusions about the disappearance of these ancient people.

1:00p-1:30p: Jack Hanna's Animal Adventures: Episode 2258 - "Protect and Preserve"

Around the world, thousands of species are on the brink of being lost forever. Though the reasons are varied, the culprit usually turns out to be human encroachment into natural habitats. On this adventure, Jack visits some of his favorite conservation projects focused on saving endangered animals, including the golden lion tamarin in Brazil, the Andean condor in Ecuador and the cheetah in Namibia.

1:30p-2:00p: Critter Gitters: Episode 306 - "Man's Best Friend"

Ranger Rick Kelly calls the Critter Gitters to the lake to help him untangle a Harris hawk which has been trapped in an abandoned fish line. Once the Critter Gitters have rescued the hawk, they discover it has followed them back to their tree house, where it has made itself a new home. In the meantime, after witnessing a splash, a brave Labrador rescues a little girl. Dr. West finds himself stranded in the middle of the lake in a sinking rubber raft with Elmer, the local bait and tackle shop owner. They are ultimately saved by the Critter Gitters.

2:00p-2:30p: Beakman's World: Episode 106 - Soap, Beak Mania and Auto Engines

Beakman reveals how soap makes water "wetter" to get things clean, explains how explosions propel automobiles and answers riveting questions such as "Do birds sweat?"

2:30p-3:00p: Beakman's World (B): Episode 406 - Catalysts, Beakmania & Aerosol Cans

Beakman clears the air about the science behind car smog and enzymes in our bodies. Then the scientist who is always up for a good laugh puts on a blindfold to meet a Beakmom challenge. Finally, Beakman stays cool under the pressure of aerosol cans.

12:00p-12:30p: Teen Kids News: Episode 4-07

Kid-to-kid newscast, created for and delivered by children. Hosted by a diverse news team made up of child "journalists" reporting from a professional news set. Meets the needs of children whose sophistication and curiosity about their world is motivated by the information explosion. Delivered eye-to-eye with a pre-adolescent sensibility and sense of humor. Emphasis on diversity and experience.

12:30p-1:00p: Exploration with Richard Wiese: Episode 204 - Endangered Predator

Richard will be in search of one of the ocean's top predators, the orca. Exploring the San Juan Islands of Washington State that are within the fertile Puget Sound, Richard will investigate the habits of these endangered creatures.

1:00p-1:30p: Jack Hanna's Animal Adventures: Episode 2260 - "Creepy Creatures"

Simply because of their appearance, some animals give people the creeps. At the top of the list: Bats, Bugs and Snakes! On this adventure, Jack shares some of his favorite creepy encounters from around the world. Come along and eat green ants in Australia, venture into a Puerto Rican cave filled with 300,000 bats and face a deadly cobra in Thailand. Jack also points out "creepy creatures" are essential to maintaining a healthy environment.

1:30p-2:00p: Critter Gitters: Episode 307 - "Sundancer"

The Critter Gitter shave been called to a mountain cabin home, where a bear has broken into the kitchen and ripped through the refrigerator. Ranger Rick tells the Critter Gitters to notify campers around the area about the hungry bear, which is now on the loose. The Critter Gitters attempt to teach Roy about food, and dealing with wildlife in the wilderness. Unfortunately, Roy is more interested in eating and fishing than he is about the local bear problem. At the end of the day, all the Critter Gitters' resources are called into action, including "Sundancer" the Critter Gitters new hawk, to save Roy, from the wild, hungry bear.

2:00p-2:30p: Beakman's World: Episode 107 - Electricity, Beak Mania & Light Bulbs

Josie interrogates Thomas Edison about how light bulbs work while Beakman, with the help of the East Bay Electrons, graphically illustrates electric current and answers ubiquitous questions such as "Are carrots really good for your eyes?"

2:30p-3:00p: Beakman's World (B): Episode 407 - Rubber, Beakmania & Hair

A viewer question about rubber puts a bounce in Beakman's step and Chef Art Burn gives away a flowery recipe for changing the color of carnations. Then, the science team combs through some hair raising facts about hair and nails.

Using nautical skills, common sense and Critter Gitter technology, the Critter Gitters once again help save the life of yet another animal.

<u>2:00p-2:30p: Beakman's World: Episode 108 – Sound, Beak Mania & Explosions</u> Beakman explores the nature of sound and how explosions happen.

2:30p-3:00p: Beakman's World (B): Episode 408 - Camels, Beakmania & Density

Scientist Beakman and his trusty assistants quench a viewer's thirst for facts about camels and water storage. Then Beakman busts open the mystery behind the painless art of karate chopping. Finally, the science team answers some heavy duty questions about the weight and density of gasses.
