TEXARKANA, Texas -- During a regular meeting Monday, the City Council will vote on accepting more than \$192,000 from lawsuit settlements related to the opioid addiction epidemic.

The Texas Attorney General's Office and negotiators for state political subdivisions last year entered into an agreement approving the allocation of settlement funds stemming from "fraudulent and/or reckless marketing and/or distribution of opioids that have resulted in addictions and overdoses," according to the resolution the Council will vote on.

The resolution would approve the entire agreement, in which Texarkana is included. A public hearing will precede the vote.

The Council will also conduct public hearings and vote on allowing a special use permit to allow a tattoo studio at 3917 N. State Line Ave. and approving amended site plans for construction at 3930 Galleria Oaks Drive and 5808 Richmond Road.

The agenda includes an open forum during which members of the public may address the Council on any topic for up to five minutes each.

The meeting is scheduled for 6 p.m. Monday at City Hall, 220 Texas Blvd. A live video stream will be available via the city's website, ci.texarkana.tx.us.
