TEXARKANA, Texas -- The second of two men charged with murder in connection with gunplay at a Texarkana, Texas, Halloween party allegedly provided the shooter transportation to and from the event.

Andre Morine, 24, was arrested Nov. 5 on a charge of murder related to a shooting at Octavia's Event Center, 2315 Texas Blvd., which left one dead and nine others wounded. Morine allegedly provided transportation to and from the scene to the alleged shooter, Keuntae McElroy, 21, according to a probable cause affidavit.

Video surveillance from a business near the party venue allegedly shows Morine drove McElroy and a third man to the party in his Cadillac.

"They exit the vehicle and Morine can clearly be seen in possession of a handgun. He hands the handgun off to an unknown black male before they enter the party," the affidavit states.

The shooting occurred at 11:57 p.m. Oct. 30. Morine's phone allegedly shows he was at the event center at that time. Phone records allegedly show Morine briefly left the party minutes after the shooting but returned after receiving a call from McElroy at 12:00 a.m. Oct. 31, which lasted almost two minutes.

According to an affidavit filed in McElroy's case, 13 spent 9 mm shell casings were collected by investigators following the shooting.
