Former Craighead County Clerk Kade Holliday yesterday (Mon) pleaded guilty to theft of property charges and has been sentenced to 10 years in prison. But, as Brandon Tabor from our partner station KASU in Jonesboro reports, he's still awaiting trial for allegedly stealing public funds while in office in 2020.

Holliday was found guilty in circuit court for stealing nearly \$14-thousand-dollars from the non-profit Northeast Arkansas Leadership and Business Council - money which he must pay in restitution along with other court costs.

Holliday was also found guilty for forging applications to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

He has been ordered to surrender to police by December 10th.

Holliday still faces felony wire fraud charges after allegedly embezzling millions of dollars from the county while serving as clerk.

That trial is scheduled for late February 2022.
