

Blue Origin's second manned flight to the edge of space has been delayed due to high winds forecast in West Texas tomorrow [**Tuesday**]. It's now been pushed to Wednesday.

Actor William Shatner will be among the four passengers aboard the New Shepard rocket. The 90-year-old talked to Good Morning America today [**Monday**] about delaying the launch by a day.

SHATNER "I'm deeply disappointed because I was building up the enthusiastic response and now we've got to wait another day, but as you point out, it is really worth it. What's a day with this extraordinary experience that we're about to have?" (:19)

Meanwhile, earlier this month, about 20 current and former employees accused the company founded by Amazon billionaire Jeff Bezos of having a toxic work environment and not following proper safety protocols.

But, Audrey Powers—a Vice President of Blue Origin who will be part of Wednesday's launch—says she feels safe.
