The number of people traveling this Thanksgiving is forecast to be up 13 percent compared to last year, which is nearing pre-pandemic levels. Triple-A says that's the biggest one-year increase since 2005. Spokesperson Nick Chabarria (chah-bar-ee-uh) says the projection comes despite increasing fuel costs.

But compared to other states, Chabarria says Arkansas currently has the second-cheapest fuel in the nation. The average cost for regular gasoline is 3-dollars-7-cents (\$3.07) a gallon, compared to the national average of 3-dollars-41 cents a gallon. Chabarria says about 90 percent of all travel around Thanksgiving is expected to be by car.
