TEXARKANA, Texas -- The Randy Sams Outreach Shelter will hold its First Annual "Randy Sams Day" at 4 p.m., Nov. 17, at the shelter's administration building to recognize the shelter's 25 years of service to homeless residents.

Besides the shelter's golden anniversary, the event will also recognize and honor the memory of a teenager who was named Randy Sams, said Jennifer Lacefield, the shelter's executive director.
