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The National Weather Service reports a Western storm system pushing towards Texas and a tropical storm pushing towards the Pacific Coast of Mexico could create a major rainmaker for South Texas and the Hill Country his week. TPR's Brian Kirkpatrick has more details.

[Forecasters say how much rain will fall on South Texas and the Hill Country on Wednesday and Thursday depends on how large tropical storm Pamela grows in the eastern Pacific off the Mexican coast.

Rain forecast models range from three to nine inches for portions of the Hill Country and to one to three inches for the I-35 corridor. Forecasters say rainfall totals will appear more clearly with time.

Another bonus for warm and dry South Texas is the storm systems should keep weekday highs in the 80s, but the weekend is shaping up as ideal with sunny skies, daytime highs in the 70s and overnight lows in the 50s.
