TEXARKANA, Texas -- A man accused in a Texarkana, Texas, shooting at a Halloween party Saturday night is now facing a charge of murder and nine counts of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon.

Bail for Keuntae McElroy, 21, totals \$1.95 million.

McElroy is accused of opening fire at the party attended by approximately 200 at Octavia's Activity Center at 2315 Texas Blvd. shortly before midnight Saturday. McElroy allegedly began shooting after a fight broke out among some of the partygoers, according to a probable cause affidavit.

Javon Gooden, 20, was fatally wounded and nine others were treated at local hospitals for non-life threatening injuries. The surviving victims range in age from 15 to 23 and include both males and females, according to earlier reports.

Witnesses allegedly identified McElroy as the shooter. McElroy allegedly handed off a firearm to someone in the parking lot of the party venue before leaving the scene in a white Grand Marquis with darkly tinted windows.

A description of the firearm as black and silver allegedly matches a social media photo of McElroy with a handgun.

McElroy is currently being held in the Bowie County jail.
