Arkansas reported three additional deaths yesterday (Sun) while the number of people with COVID-19 continues growing. Active cases were up by more than 300 people since Saturday. On Twitter, Governor Asa Hutchinson noted that since last week active cases were up by about 12-hundred. Hospitalizations were up by eight since Saturday, while the number of patients on ventilators remained the same. Hutchinson said the number of Arkansans who are currently immunized rose by about 10-thousand over the last week and said – quote – "let's beat predictions and have a safe Thanksgiving."

Mostly sunny skies today. High near 56.

It will be a bit warmer by Wednesday with highs in the mid-60s. Rain is forecast Wednesday night into Thanksgiving Day morning, It is expected to clear out by noon, with the rest of the week expected to be dry and cooler. Highs in the 50s, lows in the 30s.

A first-edition copy of the U.S. Constitution – which was sold last week for more than twice its estimated value – will eventually be on display in northwest Arkansas. The historical document was sold Thursday at a Sotheby's action, reportedly for \$43 million dollars to the owner of a hedge fund who plans to loan it to the Crystal Bridges Museum of American Arts. In a statement, the winner bidder Ken Griffin said the Constitution is – quote – "a sacred document that enshrines the rights of every American and all those who aspire to be." The board chairperson at Crystal Bridges said it's hopped the document can be on display by the middle of the coming year.
