TMS is bringing back its Murder Mystery Dinners, starting with "A Very Victorian Murder" Mystery, starting at 6:30 p.m., Nov. 27 at the P.J. Ahern Home at 403 Laurel St.

"Each guest participates in the mystery in some way," said TMS Curator Jamie Simmons.
"Everyone is assigned a character to play and each character also has an assignment that either sheds light on the mystery, or provides a red herring that throws the other characters off the trail."

With the Victorian Era lasting the length of Queen Victoria's reign (1837-1901) the P.J. Ahern Home itself, constructed in 1905, comes close to nearly being included in that history.
