And so far, the tax is more of a mixed bag when it comes to helping the environment, but it is helping the city's revenue-raking in thousands each month. WDBJ's Daniel Grimes explains the city's approach to allocating all that money. A five-cent plastic bag tax can add up. It's helped the city of Roanoke raise nearly 200 thousand dollars since January. Joe Cobb, Roanoke Council: "We really didn't create this to generate revenue. We wanted to create cultural change." According to the Virginia Department of Taxation, Roanoke has raised \$9 thousand 200 and 63 dollars in the first six months from the tax. April was the highest grossing-bringing in nearly 19 thousand in revenue. May and June saw a dip, with both seeing around 14 thousand 500 dollars.
