These programs are selected for quality and appropriate content, presentation and technical excellence, with our audience – real and potential – in mind.

We continue to broadcast NPR's "From the Top." From the Top is a non-profit organization that encourages and celebrates the commitment of young people to music and the arts through a variety of media, including nationally broadcast radio shows. The show aims to entertain, educate and connect young musicians, their parents and teachers. It features young musicians who demonstrate that classical music has a place in youth culture.

We also continue to broadcast PBS' NewsHour, a news program hosted by Judy Woodruff that airs each weekday from 7-8 PM. NewsHour presents coverage of a wide range of subjects, as below:

In *International News*, ever since the withdrawal of the United States of America and its allies, and the Taliban takeover of Afghanistan, the global community has cut off non-humanitarian aid, frozen assets abroad and imposed sanctions on the new government. Along with the drought and harsh winter, many Afghans have had to endure desperate lengths to keep themselves and their families alive.

Special correspondent Villem Mark reported on millions of Ukrainians that have fled the war and sought refuge in nations to the west, including Moldova, the most-impooverished nation in Europe. More than 300,000 refugees have arrived in the former Soviet republic, which has a population of 2.9 million people. While many have moved on, the strain still remains.

President Biden's visit to Poland directed a spotlight on that country's importance to the military and humanitarian effort in Ukraine. Since the start of the invasion of Ukraine, no nation has become more important to western efforts to repel Russia. Stephen Mull, former United States ambassador to Poland and the vice provost for global affairs at the University of Virginia, joined Nick Schiffrin in a candid discussion.

Nearly 5,000 people have been killed and 160,000 remain trapped inside the city of Mariupol without heat, water or electricity. Ukraine said the city is on the verge of a humanitarian catastrophe, but no evacuation corridors were agreed upon, fearing Russia would launch attacks on anyone trying to flee.

In *National News*, as a candidate he pledged to diversify the federal bench and his decision to appoint a Black woman to the Supreme Court has dominated recent headlines. Lisa Desjardins joined Judy Woodruff in a discussion of the major push by President Biden to reshape the American courts.

Former Secretary of State Madeleine Albright, who died Wednesday, March 23, 2022 after a battle with cancer, was known by most everyone in Washington, D.C. in the world of politics, statecraft, and journalism. Susan Rice, one of Albright's longtime friends and one of her successors as United States Ambassador to the United Nations, joined Judy Woodruff to discuss her legacy.

Shortly after a jury in Georgia found three white men guilty of federal hate crimes in the murder of Ahmaud Arbery, Attorney General Merrick Garland said, "the Justice Department has a legal obligation to prosecute hate crimes. And as Americans, all of us have a moral obligation to combat the hatred and bigotry that motivates those crimes."

A man suspected of stalking and shooting homeless people asleep on the streets of New York City and the District of Columbia, was arrested. Police said at least two people were killed and three others wounded in the attacks.

Three former Minneapolis police officers have been convicted in federal court of violating George Floyd's civil rights. They were on the scene assisting fellow officer Derek Chauvin when he pressed his knee into Floyd's neck for more than nine minutes, killing him and setting off a wave of racial justice protests worldwide.

Tornadoes tore through New Orleans and surrounding areas leaving behind devastation, with overturned vehicles, downed power lines, street lights, and homes completely destroyed. At least one person was killed. Louisiana has activated hundreds of National Guard personnel to clear up roadways and assist in local search efforts.

The Senate Judiciary Committee postponed a vote that would have moved ahead the nomination of Judge Ketanji Brown Jackson to serve on the Supreme Court. Republicans on the committee requested the weeklong delay with Senator Chuck Grassley, R-Iowa saying Jackson's record was "incomplete." The committee has scheduled to vote on her nomination on Monday, April 4, 2022.

In Supreme Court News this quarter, the Court heard oral arguments on two cases related to whether people awaiting trial in immigration court have the right to a bond hearing.

Janai Nelson, associate director-counsel of the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund, joined Geoff Bennett in a discussion of the new ruling from the United States Supreme Court that has major implications for voting rights in this country. The court reinstated Alabama's congressional map, one that a lower court had found racially discriminated against Black voters.

The Supreme Court heard lengthy arguments that challenged the Biden administration's vaccine and testing workplace requirements and as in all issues that surround the pandemic and vaccines, strong opinions were sparked.

After more than 27 years on the bench, Justice Stephen Breyer has prepared to step down. Judy Woodruff joined by legal veterans Gregory Garre, a former United States Solicitor General who has argued in front of the court, and Neal Katyal, former acting United States Solicitor General, who clerked for Breyer reflected on what his absence will mean for the future.

In *Media, Arts and Culture News*, People across Europe, Israel, and the world prepared to mark international Holocaust Remembrance Day, commemorating millions of European Jews killed by Nazi Germany. The day was created in 2005 by the United Nations to sustain public awareness.

Geoff Bennett reflected on the life and legacy of Oscar-winning actor Sidney Poitier who died at the age of 94. Poitier transformed how Black characters were portrayed on screen and became the first Black actor to win an Academy Award for best lead performance.

André Leon Talley, the towering former creative director and editor-at-large of *Vogue* magazine, has died. He had a front row seat to fashion shows around the world, and provided his readers a lens into that world through his writing. Jeffrey Brown shared appreciation of Talley as part of arts and culture series, CANVAS.

Maryland's Democratic Representative Jamie Raskin gained national attention when he was tapped to lead the second impeachment trial against then President Trump. The appointment came soon after losing his son to suicide. In the deeply personal book, "Unthinkable: Trauma, Truth, and the Trials of American Democracy," he wrote about his son's battle with depression, his death, and the January 6 attack.

In Durham, North Carolina at Duke University, Mike Krzyzewski coached his final home game for the Blue Devils. Krzyzewski, the most successful college men's basketball coach in American history, won 1,123 games, five national championships and three times coach of the gold medal U.S. Olympic team. For 42 seasons, he mentored countless young men and garnered the support of fans. Coach K spoke with reporters two days before his last game.

Advocates have sounded the alarm about a set of measures that targeted teaching and writing related to LGBTQ issues, race and freedom of speech. Around the country, efforts to ban specific books or even whole categories of books have been on the rise. Jeffrey Brown reported for the arts and culture series, "CANVAS."

In *Education News*, out of nearly 100,000 public schools in the United States of America, more than 90 percent have returned to in-person classes. But concerns over the spread of COVID has led some districts to close for the first two weeks of 2022 and return to virtual learning. Geoff Bennett revealed five facts behind those decisions in Newark schools.

As students, teachers and parents across the United States sought to find some sense of normalcy or stability two years into a global pandemic, the PBS NewsHour Student Reporting Labs investigated how in "Our New Normal: How Teens Are Redefining School Life."

For two years, the pandemic has hammered schools and accentuated the staffing shortages. It has led to enormous problems with teacher morale, burnout, school closures and learning losses. However, some states have been using the National Guard to fill in the gaps. Becky Pringle, president of the National Education Association, which represents 3 million educators, joined Amna Nawaz with the details.

In *Health News*, the daily average number of new COVID cases in the United States from omicron has finally dropped below the peak of the delta wave. But the nation still averages more than 145,000 new cases and 2,400 deaths per day, leaving many people with questions about balancing risk and safety. Katelyn Jetelina, an epidemiologist at the University of Texas, joined John Yang to discuss the details.

Dr. Paul Farmer, a physician, anthropologist and founder of a leading global health organization, died at the age of 62. The group he co-founded, Partners in Health, said he died in his sleep. Special correspondent Fred de Sam Lazaro took a look at Farmer's life, legacy and his impact on the world.

Amna Nawaz introduced us to a pair of modern-day history makers: the Blackstock sisters, physicians who have dedicated themselves to work at the intersection of medicine, health equity and systemic racism. The story was part of the *PBS Newshour* series, "Race Matters."

When healthcare journalist and podcaster Max Lugavere's mother was diagnosed with a form of Parkinson's disease, he drew on medical studies to train himself on the best practices for improving brain health through food. Lugavere has released a brain-healthy cookbook entitled "Genius Kitchen." Lugavere shared with the *PBS Newshour* what he learned from his mother's battle with a neurological illness.

The United States Food and Drug Administration and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention endorsed a second booster shot of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines for those over 50. Younger people with badly weakened immune systems were also encouraged. The move came as vaccinations slowed markedly and new versions of the omicron variant began spreading. William Brangham and Judy Woodruff discussed the details.
