Clean Air Campaign

As Georgia grows, so do its traffic congestion and air quality challenges. Addressing these challenges requires a full-range of strategies -- from strategic investments in new transportation supply to demand management strategies that ensure we are making the most efficient use of our transportation investments.

The Clean Air Campaign works under contract with Georgia DOT to deploy a suite of cost-effective demand management programs and services to Georgia employers, commuters and schools.

The Clean Air Campaign and its partners offer assistance to more than 1,600 employers to design and implement commute options programs that make business sense; protect public health; offer targeted incentives to commuters and employers; provide Smog Alert notifications; and work with elementary, middle and high schools to protect children from harmful pollution and empower children to take a positive role in reducing traffic and cleaning the air.

The Clean Air Campaign also secures private funding through corporate and foundation grants to conduct additional programs and expand its impact.

Each day, these efforts help reduce traffic by more than 1.4 million vehicle miles and keep 700 tons of pollution out of the air we breathe.

Through SRTA, user fees have been successfully utilized to build the Sidney Lanier Bridge over the Brunswick River, the Torras Causeway, “the gateway” to the St. Simons community and the Georgia 400 Highway corridor.

Representatives from SRTA came in to discuss the Peach Pass and the new Pay N’ Go option for commuters. A Peach Pass is a small, thin electronic toll collection device similar to the GA Cruise Card that adheres to a vehicle windshield OR a bumper that mounts to the front of your vehicle. The Peach Pass is connected to an account established with the State Road and Tollway Authority (SRTA) that automatically deducts the proper tolls when using the electronic toll lanes of the I-85 Express Lanes and any future toll roads in the state of Georgia.

The Pay n Go Peach Pass is their newest option for motorists who want greater choices for more reliable commute times. Commuters who prefer to use cash to open or reload their Peach Pass account have that option. CVS or Walgreens locations will make Pay n Go Peach Pass’ available with your desired amount, from \$20 to \$500.
