10-9-19

Secretary Benson is urging Michigan residents to apply for the REAL ID as the deadline is approaching. The Real ID allows residents to fly within the United States and allows access to some federal buildings. Without the Real ID some residents will be prevented from doing so. Starting in October 2020 a regular state id or drivers license will not be enough to board an aircraft for a domestic flight or enter military bases, nuclear power plants or other federal facilities. 10-14-19

Members of the United Auto Workers have been offered the option of finding part time work amid the strike. The strike is going on four weeks but starting this week, strikers will see an increase in pay from \$250 per week to \$275. This raise in pay follows the executive vote that took place last week. This vote not only raised the strike pay for General Motors and Amtrak but gave the option for strikers to work a part time job without reducing their strike pay as long as they are still taking part in their picket duties. Almost 50,000 UAW members are currently on strike.

Michigan residents could see another relief at the gas pump this week. Gas prices are down more than a dime this week. Drivers are paying an average of \$2.58 per gallon. This price is 30 cents cheaper than it was this time last year. The average driver is paying about \$38 to fill up their tank.

10-25-19

Michigan could see its first winter blast sooner than later. Forecasters predict that late next week people in northern Michigan can expect snow and very cold weather. Some parts of Michigan will see temperatures drop to 30 to 40 degrees. But no worries because forecasters are saying there are still some 50-degree weather days left in the year.

A new art exhibit will be coming to the Ella Sharp Museum. The exhibit is presented by the S.A.R.A.H. foundation and it is set to debut on November 2 nd. It will spotlight the Career center visual communication student's artwork and local artists. The funds raised from this event will go toward scholarships and Suicide Prevention education.

11-11-19

Our winter weather advisory is currently in progress. The advisory has been issued for Jackson county until 7pm tonight. Overnight the temperature dropped to below freezing and the roads may be slick out this morning. Drivers are advised to slow down during their morning commute. The Jackson area could see about four inches of snow accumulate today.

11-18-19

Michigan residents who are heading down south for the winter are encouraged to renew their license and plates before leaving. Drivers have the ability to renew their plates up to six months before they expire. Drivers over the age of 21 have the ability to renew their licenses up to a year early. Residents have the option to renew online at express.sos.mi.gov or at their local Secretary of State. Residents who visit their local secretary of state are encouraged to set an appointment to avoid wait time.

11-22-19

After being closed for five months, the Jackson Community Food Pantry has reopened. The food pantry closed after a malfunction with a freezer that caused a mess that took five months to clean up and suspended operation of the pantry. The organization received donations and benefitted from fundraisers to help reopen the doors. The pantry has been open for almost 12 years and provides food for 100 families or 400 people. The organization is entirely donation based.

12-04-19

This week is National Influenza Vaccination week and the Michigan department of health and human resources reminds Michigan residents to get vaccinated. Right now, only 46.1% of Michigan residents reported receiving the flu vaccine last year. This is below the national average of 49.1%. Michigan is ranked 38th in the nation for flu vaccination coverage. The center for disease control and prevention recommends annual influenza vaccines for everyone over the age of six months.

12-06-19

The Jackson Fire Department held a shopping event for local kids at the Walmart in Jackson last night. Firefighters assisted more than a dozen kids with holiday shopping. This annual effort from JFD is now in its 11th year.

The American Red cross is asking residents to consider a lifesaving gift this holiday season by making an appointment to donate blood or platelets. This is to ensure a sufficient supply is available for patients throughout the holiday season. Those with type O blood are especially needed.
